



Norway: Western Fjords Adventure

ENJOY a guided tour of the UNESCO listed Bergen Wharf, with its historic wooden warehouses.

STAY in a beautiful historic hotel with incredible views that has hosted royals, authors, and dignitaries for more than a century.

VISIT an uncrowded part of Jostedalsbreen National Park to see a section of the largest glacier in continental Europe.



TOUR ITINERARY

Day One

Arrive at Bergen Airport (BGO) during the day and transfer to downtown by local bus or taxi.

Check in at Bergen Børs Hotel in the heart of Bergen. If you have the time, you may either relax or explore downtown on foot. Join the guides and the rest of the group for a Meet & Greet followed by a welcome dinner at the hotel.



Day Two

Following breakfast at the hotel, we go on a guided walking tour of the UNESCO World Heritage listed Bryggen. Bryggen, the old wharf of Bergen, is a reminder of the town's importance as part of the Hanseatic League's trading empire from the 14th to the mid-16th century. The wooden trading houses are relics of an urban landscape that no longer exists elsewhere in northern Europe.

After a light lunch we check out and leave for a scenic boat tour along the coast to Florø. The voyage takes about three hours and our fellow passengers may be a mix of travelers and local commuters.

We arrive in Kalvåg in the early evening and a quick transfer takes us to our hotel. Dinner at the hotel restaurant features amazingly fresh seafood.





Day Three

After breakfast we'll go on a guided walk through this historic fishing village, led by a local with strong ties to the community. Afterwards we'll continue the walk up to a viewpoint on a hill for a view of the archipelago.

Arriving back from the walk, we're likely hungry for lunch, which will be at a harborside restaurant. In the afternoon we're boarding two boats for a guided visit to Vingen, one of the largest rock carving sites in Northern Europe. The Vingen site is hard-to-reach and requires permits to visit. More than 1,500 petroglyphs are found here, mostly depicting deer, and also humans and other wildlife. The visit offers a glimpse into the past along these rocky shores. Evening dinner is at a local restaurant.

Day Four

After breakfast and check out, we get on the bus, drive across the island and to the mainland. We pass Hornelen, a high seacliff that's been used a navigational landmark since the Viking era. Driving along Nordfjord we arrive at a tiny village and stop for a cup of coffee (or tea) at a small sheep farm that dates back 150 years or so.

After a nice chat with the current residents of the farm, we cross the fjord and arrive in Nordfjordeid. Here you have some time to explore the village and visit the Sagastad Viking Ship Museum.

We continue the last leg of our drive in the afternoon, which includes the spectacular Panorama Road, and on to our next hotel. Hotel Alexandra is family-owned and has a long tradition of hosting guests in these beautiful parts. The hotel offers great features like a spa, swimming pools, and tremendous views. Dinner tonight is at the hotel, which offers an extensive buffet.





Day Five

Following breakfast we drive into Lodalen valley along a glacial lake. We transfer to a boat and keep going to the far end of the lake, flanked by the dramatic valley on our sides.

After 45 minutes we arrive at a quay and start walking further into the valley on a forest gravel road. The walk is about 3.75 miles (and you may transfer on our bus instead if you choose). From the end of the road, there's a 15 minute walk to a beautiful viewpoint for the Kjenndals glacier, which is part of the massive Jostedals glacier (the largest glacier in continental Europe). We'll take in the stunning valley with steep waterfalls at all sides, before the short walk back to our bus. We stop at a lakeside cafe for lunch and make it back to the hotel in the mid afternoon. Relax and enjoy one of the swimming pools or spa at Alexandra Hotel before tonight's dinner.

When it's time for dinner we meet up and walk five minutes to the Skylift cable car. The Skylift brings us more than 3,000 feet up to the top of Mount Hoven, home to a restaurant with stupendous views of Nordfjord below. After a delicious meal we return to the valley floor by cable car for a restful night's sleep.





Day Six

Following breakfast we'll check out and leave by bus. The first leg is an hour drive up and over the Strynefjell mountain pass. If we're lucky, we may see migrating reindeer in the mountains. Soak in the breathtaking view as we descend to the Geiranger Fjord, one of the two UNESCO World Heritage listed fjords in Norway.

We board a RIB boat in Geiranger for a short sightseeing transfer to Skagehola. Cruising the fjord we see the magnificent Seven Sisters Waterfalls cascading 1,350 feet into the fjord. We deboard and hike % of a mile up a steep but well-paved path to the Skageflå mountain farm. This amazingly situated farm provides perhaps the most stunning view of the tour—and a picture perfect place for a picnic lunch!

We'll return the same way we came, and board a ferry in Geiranger to Hellesylt. The transfer is about an hour and completes our journey for the full length of the Geiranger Fjord. From Hellesylt we drive off the beaten path into a beautiful side valley called Norangsdalen. After a scenic stop at the Lyngstøls Lake we soon arrive at our next accommodation. Hotel Union Øye is a pearl of a hotel steeped in history—the last German emperor Kaiser Wilhelm II met other royals there more than a century ago.



Day Seven

Following breakfast, we leave the hotel on foot for a quick walk to the put-in for the kayaks. We'll paddle a section of the beautiful Norangsfjord to Urke. For those not interested in or able to kayak, enjoy a quick drive to Urke, followed by a walk to a scenic viewpoint. Lunch today is at a waterfront cafe with the best fjord view you can imagine. After lunch we return to the hotel, a 10 minute transfer.

Breakfast, lunch, and dinner included.



Day Eight

On our last day in the fjords we start with a scenic drive to the Art Nouveau town of Ålesund. Crossing fjords and stopping to take in the scenery along the way, we leave the jagged peaks of the Sunnmøre Alps behind. We arrive midday, check in at the hotel, and then enjoy some free time to explore Ålesund and lunch on your own. We'll meet afterwards for a guided walk through this charming town on an island in the fjord, led by a local guide who brings Ålesund's dramatic history to life. Tonight we'll sit down for a farewell dinner at a fantastic restaurant in town.

Breakfast and dinner included.



Day Nine

After a good night's rest we begin to say our goodbyes as this is the end of our adventure.


Depending on flight time, you may have some additional time to explore in Ålesund in the morning. The transfer to Ålesund's airport, Vigra, takes about 20 minutes.

Bergen Børs Hotel Bergen

Located in the heart of the city, Bergen Børs Hotel is a stunning Renaissance Revival building and the former home to Bergen's stock exchange, dating back to 1862. Now transformed into one of the Bergen's most stylish accommodations, it offers a luxurious stay. Enjoy marble flooring and walnut paneling on its ground floor and elegant rooms with comfortable beds and bathrooms.

As is common with boutique hotels, room sizes and views are often different within the same property. Please note that we assign guest rooms on a first come, first serve basis. No exceptions.

Knutholmen Hotel

Knutholmen Hotel is located on an island facing the Atlantic Ocean, almost at the westernmost point of Norway. Knutholmen is a family-run hotel made up of historic sea houses in stunning surroundings, and its restaurant is known for its excellent seafood.

FAQ - GETTING THERE AND BACK

Is This Trip For Me?

Our Western Fjords Adventure requires moderate mobility and physical fitness. You should be able to walk on uneven, natural terrain hiking trails for at least three miles unassisted and comfortably enter and exit vans, buses, boats, and kayaks, without assistance. One of the walks is a steep % climb on steps up to a beautiful viewpoint. We'll walk leisurely and hope that everyone can join us to the top. We spend a significant amount of time on water, so guests must feel comfortable on large and small boats. The ability to kayak in a calm fjord will also add to your experience.

When should I arrive in Bergen?

You should arrive in Bergen (airport code BGO) during the morning or afternoon on Day One of the tour. If you wish to arrive early and spend more time in Bergen, let us know if you would like help setting up extra nights at the hotel.

What if I want to come explore other parts of the country before or after the trip?

> If you'd like to visit Oslo or other parts of Norway prior to your trip, let us know if you want any travel tips!

What do I need to do to prepare for my journey?

➤ Book your flight to Bergen (BGO) for anytime on or before Day One of the trip. After booking we will send you a pre-trip guide that includes local information and a packing list.

What are the meals like?

> Breakfasts are usually buffet-style at the hotels with a wide selection to choose from.

Unless we're stopping by a cafe or restaurant, lunches are the traditional Norwegian *matpakke* — a lunch we prepare and bag at breakfast from slices of bread, cheese, jam, cold cuts, fruit and more. Most Norwegians bring their *matpakke* with them daily to eat lunch at work, school, or on the trail.

Dinners are either at the hotels or a restaurant nearby. Freshly caught seafood from the North Atlantic Ocean is always a great option in these parts, but there are of course plenty of options at any given restaurant including meats (most frequently beef, lamb, pork, and chicken), pasta, and vegetarian fare.



FAQ - GETTING THERE AND BACK

Where do we depart from?

On the last day of the tour most guests will likely depart from Ålesund Airport, which is also named Ålesund Vigra
Airport (airport code AES). This airport serves a variety of Norwegian cities and international destinations elsewhere in
Europe.

How do I sign up?

- > Secure your spots with a \$500 per person deposit (via phone, email, or on our <u>website</u>) that is fully refundable within 30 days of payment, provided your trip starts at least 121 days from the time of booking.
